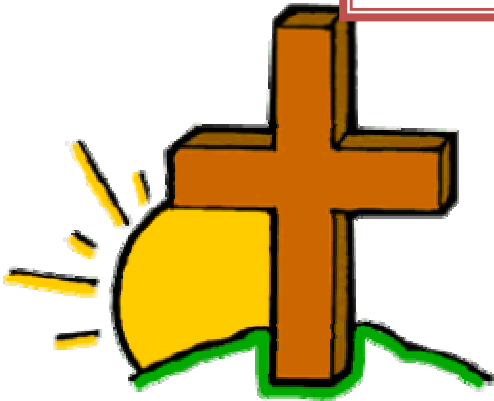

All children need to have their p.e kit in school including footwear for p.e on Tuesdays. School will no longer supply spare clothes except in an emergency.

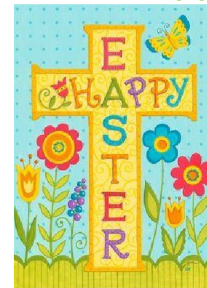
Thanks to Revd. David and his team together with the volunteers. We enjoyed 'The Easter Experience' at Neatishead Church.

Winter Vegetable Lasagne

Enough for 4 grown ups

Ingredients

2 tablespoons oil	400g tin chopped tomatoes
1 medium onion, chopped	lasagne sheets
2 cloves of garlic, peeled and grated	2 tablespoons tomato puree
3 carrots, grated or finely chopped	200ml crème fraiche
1 squash, finely chopped	125g cheddar, grated
Handful of spinach	
Handful of mushrooms chopped	
Handful of fresh basil and 1 tsp of dried oregano or 2 teaspoons dried mixed herbs	

Method

- Heat the oil in a large pan.
- Add onions and garlic and soften.
- Stir in the carrots and squash and cook for 5 minutes.
- Stir in mushrooms and spinach and soften for 3 minutes.
- Stir in tomatoes, tomato puree, basil and oregano, simmer for 10 minutes.
- In an oven proof dish build up layers of the sauce and lasagne sheets, finishing with a lasagne sheet.
- Top with a layer of crème fraiche and grated cheddar.
- Bake at 180C for 30 minutes OR microwave* on 70% for 5-8 minutes (or until piping hot) and leave to stand covered for 2 minutes before eating.

*If microwaving please ensure that it is in an appropriate container and cover the lasagne while it cooks.

95.56%

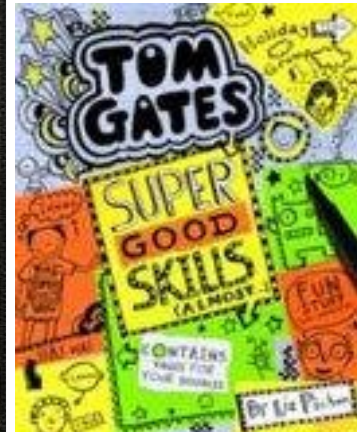
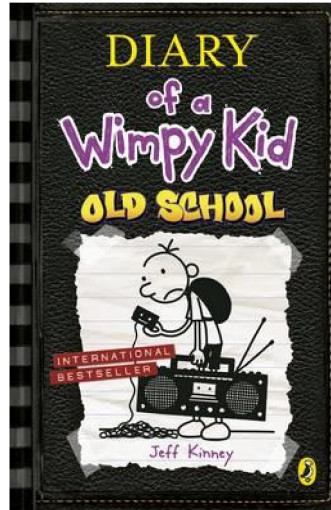
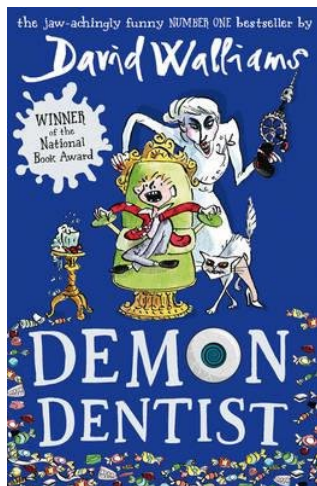
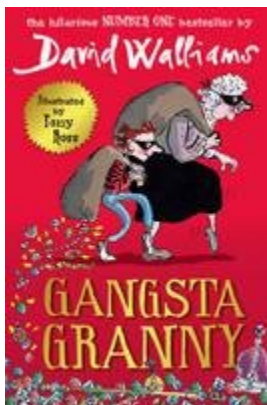
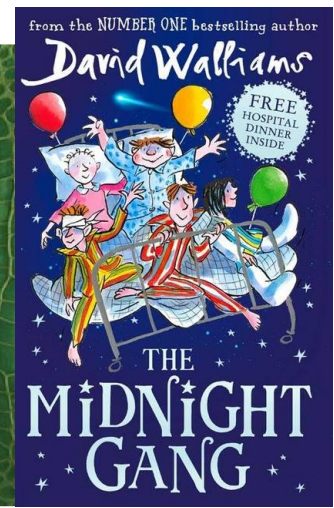
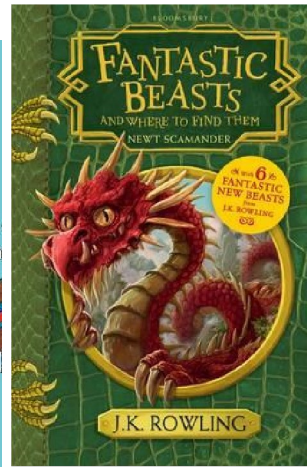
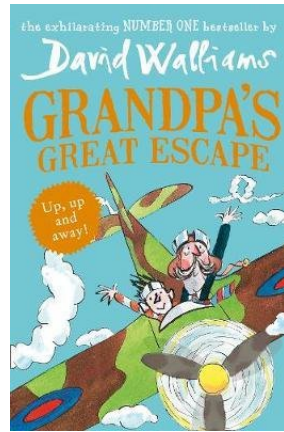
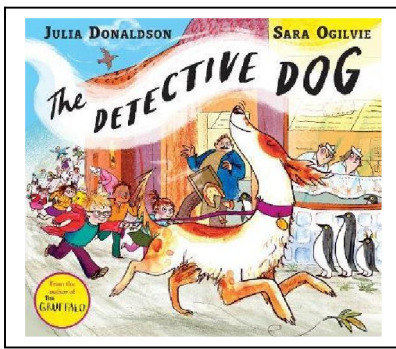

GRA is the Games Rating Authority which is an arm of the Video Standards Council. The GRA exists to provide ratings information for games using the PEGI rating system.

PEGI 3 - eg. *Angry Birds*—Suitable for all age groups

PEGI 7 —eg. *Minecraft* —Will contain fighting scenes, sounds and unrealistic violence

PEGI 12 —eg. *World of Warcraft* —Graphic and realistic violence, mild swearing and may contain horror content.

PEGI 16 —eg. *Star Wars Battlefront* —Violence, death and injury, nudity, bad language and use of alcohol and drugs.
