## **Collective Worship**

We enjoy collective worship every morning. Tuesdays always feel a bit more special as they are led by a member of one of our churches. We are always happy to welcome Revd David, Revd Nev, Revd Rob and Mrs Lamb.

Our Collective Worship is a wonderful time for us to ask questions, reflect and sing together.





We started the half term with the story of Hannah, in the book of 1 Samuel in the Bible, asking God for a son. This prompted our Big Question "Does God always answer prayer?" What a lot of discussion this has created and a lot of other questions too! Does it matter who prays or where we pray? Is there a right way to pray? Why do some prayers never seem to be answered? We have then followed the life of Samuel as he was called to serve God and lead the people of God. What a difficult job that was; the people were so quick to forget the amazing things God had done for them from Egypt, through the Wilderness and into the Promised Land. Perhaps your child can remember some of those great miracles?

The children are enthusiastic, learning verses and remembering some tricky names each week! We are looking forward to next half term when we will find out about the first king of Israel and the next Big Question!
