Attendance Targets

Our school attendance this year is 96.6% (national average 96.1%) Our attendance has improved - thank you. If we excluded unauthorised holidays, our attendance is 97.4%. Good attendance is linked to school achievement.

From September 2018-the school, in line with Broadland High School and other local primary schools will adopt Norfolk County Council's Fixed Penalty Notice Policy (more details to follow in September)

Year 6 End of Year National Curriculum Assessments

When children are entered in primary school, they are expected to take part in National Curriculum Assessments. These SATs feature throughout the children's school lives and prepare them for high school. We believe that the delivery of these assessments is key. To prepare, Year 6 have participated in weekly informal and formal testing. Every Friday, they have enjoyed small reading groups with an adult ratio 2:1. They have also completed arithmetic papers in an environment which encourages talking. This informal approach to test papers helps them overcome any fears - children enjoy asking, 'How did you find the answer?' This improves confidence levels, and combined with the children's work ethic, has produced incredible results. 100% of children met the expected standard in 100% of their SATs. They should be as proud of themselves as we are of them. Wonderful.

Red Skippers Class

The Red Skippers have worked extremely hard this year and everyone has made lots of progress. Our topics have been very exciting and we have enjoyed finding out new information, sharing fabulous stories and making books. Our Year Two pupils undertook Key Stage One tests and the results were very pleasing. Our Reception children have learnt achieved very well, with 86% achieving a good level of development in the final assessments.

We have enjoyed many musical experiences this year, from our wonderful Christmas production, the CASMA India fusion project with the Peacocks and the whole school celebration of The Ugly Bug Ball.

Our Forest School sessions have been a massive success. The development of our outdoor learning area has allowed us greater opportunities for using tools, making, dens, lighting fires and cooking some delicious food! All pupils have had the opportunity to take part in learning outside the classroom and we have seen the children become more independent, good at problem solving and keen to create and solve challenges.

Technology

Why do children enjoy using technology? Is it because the use has the power to edit, retrieve and enhance their initial product?

Peacock Class and Red Skippers

Each day, 'Show & Tell' has become a firm favourite. It has become common place for children to bring photographs, sometimes digital images, which are beamed to our display screen using Apple TV. Learning at home is regularly shared in class. During presentations, children ask: 'What? Where? How? Why?'

questions which provide excitement, engagement and a love of sharing. Technology has created a platform for such discussion. Peacock Class have used Sphero Robots to create code. These robots use wireless technology (iPads) and allow the children to enhance their understanding of 3-dimensional objects, using maths tools (such as protractors) to program movement. Being able to follow an algorithm helped the class greatly when they made cars, smoothies and visited Pizza Express. Red Skippers have programmed Beebot Machines which are limited to 90 degree turns. The class have made predictions about which possible shapes can or cannot be made before coding a procedure.





2017-2018 Sports...What a busy sporting year! Sports day at the UEA, Broadland Cluster Sports Events, Netball and Premier Sports after school, it's all happening here at Neatishead Primary School.
