### Our topic this term will be Fantastical Tales

We will enjoy listening to traditional and modern tales, using them across the curriculum to make our learning exciting and fun!



As readers and writers we will be concentrating on listening, speaking, drama, reading, writing and spelling. As mathematicians we will be counting and using numbers to add and subtract. As historians we will be discovering facts about castles including finding out how they were built, who lived in them and what their jobs may have involved. As scientists we will learn about the parts of the body, our senses, our needs, eg: food, water and we will investigate the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and personal hygiene.
