

Reading at Neatishead Primary School

At Neatishead Primary School we encourage children to read for pleasure and the children borrow a book from the school library regularly to share at home. We follow the National Curriculum and understand how to progress children with their reading. Children are taught the key skills of reading through group phonics sessions, whole class shared reading, small group guided reading and through paired or individual reading and each child takes a book home to practise that is suited to their individual needs. We encourage and support parents to read with their children at home. We are fortunate to have experienced volunteers who offer targeted support in reading.
