



Special Visitor - Music

We have had an amazing opportunity this week. We participated in a zoom chat with Ben Rogerson, a cellist for the BBC Concert Orchestra. We were fascinated to hear him play a range of familiar tunes and to hear him talk about his love of music.



In English we are reading "Harry and the bucketful of Dinosaurs". We are using this text to help us orally rehearse a story before writing. We have worked together to create a story map to help us remember the key points in the story. We have learnt about personal pronouns and how to use these to avoid repetition in our writing. We have continued looking at spelling rules for adding suffixes: ing, ed and er and have looked at the suffix est. We have been spelling words with nk endings and thinking about which suffixes we can add.

Dinosaur Detectives

We have been sent a challenge from The Natural History Museum to create a Jurassic backdrop scene. We have started making leaves to help create our scene. On the challenge was a photo of a massive footprint which we have identified as belonging to a Diplodocus so we started some detective work to find facts about the Diplodocus and we have been developing our drawing skills to create our own pictures.

We have also looked at a map of the world in the Dinosaur times and we were amazed how differently it looks from a map of the world today.

Reading: Please listen to your child read at least three times a week


Doodle: children to use Doodle English & Doodle Maths at least once a week.
