

The Savage Stone Age!

We will be going back thousands of years to find out about life in the Stone Age. We will be sharing lots of fiction and information books, including Stone Age boy by Satoshi Kitamura, Ug by Raymond Briggs and Ug-a-lug by Jill Lewis. Using these books we will write stories, make posters, create instructions, developing our writing and spelling skills.



As scientists we will investigate the properties of materials, asking questions such as: What is it made of? Why is this a suitable material? Can this material be changed? How are these materials similar or different?



As historians we will research past events related to the

human race. We will ask: Who were the Stone Age people and when did they live? How did the Stone Age people find food? What did the Stone Age people eat?



We will step in the shoes

of geographers to explore the location of The United Kingdom within the world, asking: Where in the world am I? What are the names of the seas around the United Kingdom? What is the capital of the United Kingdom?



As artists we will find out about cave paintings, create collages and we shall cook vegetable soup and bake barley bread.



As musicians we will

learn about how songs told stories and we will learn songs about the Stone Age. We will also use instruments to make the songs more interesting!



As mathematicians we will be counting, adding, subtracting, multiplying, dividing and reading and writing numbers, using our topic to help us.



In RE, we will ask what Jewish people could learn from the story of Moses?

We will ask: Who was Moses? Why did people follow him? Did he make a difference?
