We have had a fantastic week back. Here is a taste of what we've been learning... In DT we have been thinking about possible staple diets in the Stone Age and learning how to use special stones to grind grain to make flour. The children had lots of fun but it was hard work! In Maths we have been comparing halves and quarters and adding fractions with the same denominator (e.g.  $\frac{1}{4} + \frac{2}{4}$ ) and looking at equivalent fractions.
