Children are developing the confidence to move *matching pairs*.

Year 6 will have the chance to affirm their understanding ahead of Assessment Week, this will include mastery questions during small group work, and discussing answers to the challenges sent home before the Easter holiday.

Theme

The class will study natural resources in the UK to discover how energy, food and minerals are distributed. Using maps, we'll locate countries and describe different types of settlement. With an opportunity to study the Stone Age, we'll consider the chronology of events – what are good sources?
